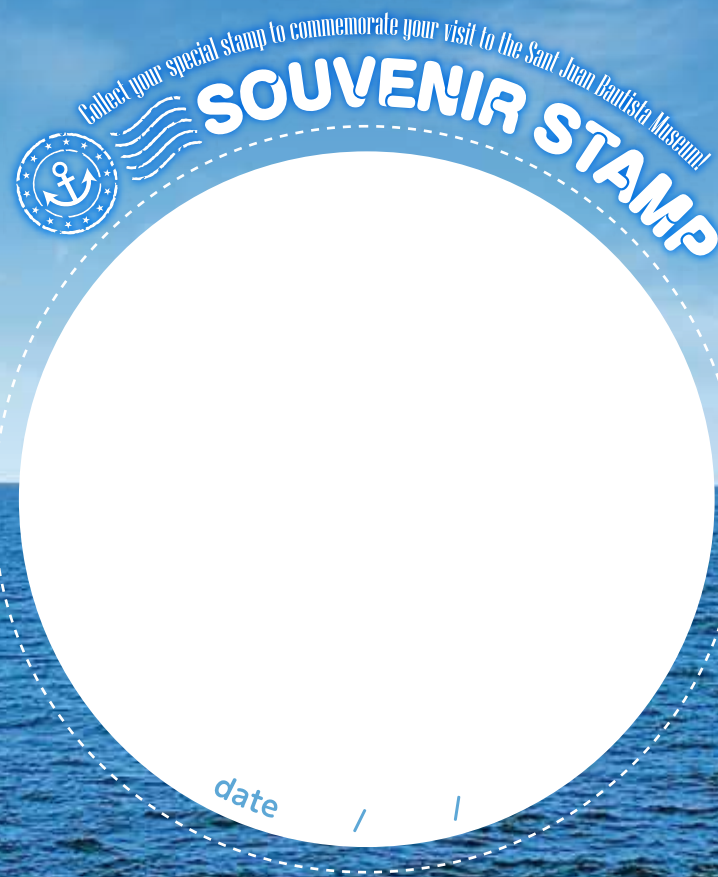


Dreaming big, crossing the oceans,

Bautista' set sail from here in Ishinomaki.

## How to find us



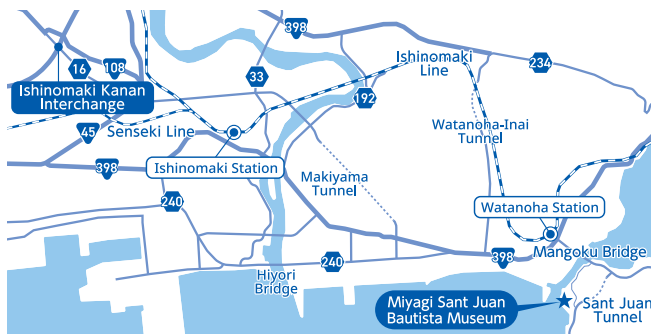
Take the Ishinomaki Line from Ishinomaki Station  
to Watanoha Station.  
Museum is located a 5 minute taxi ride/25 minute  
walk from Watanoha Station

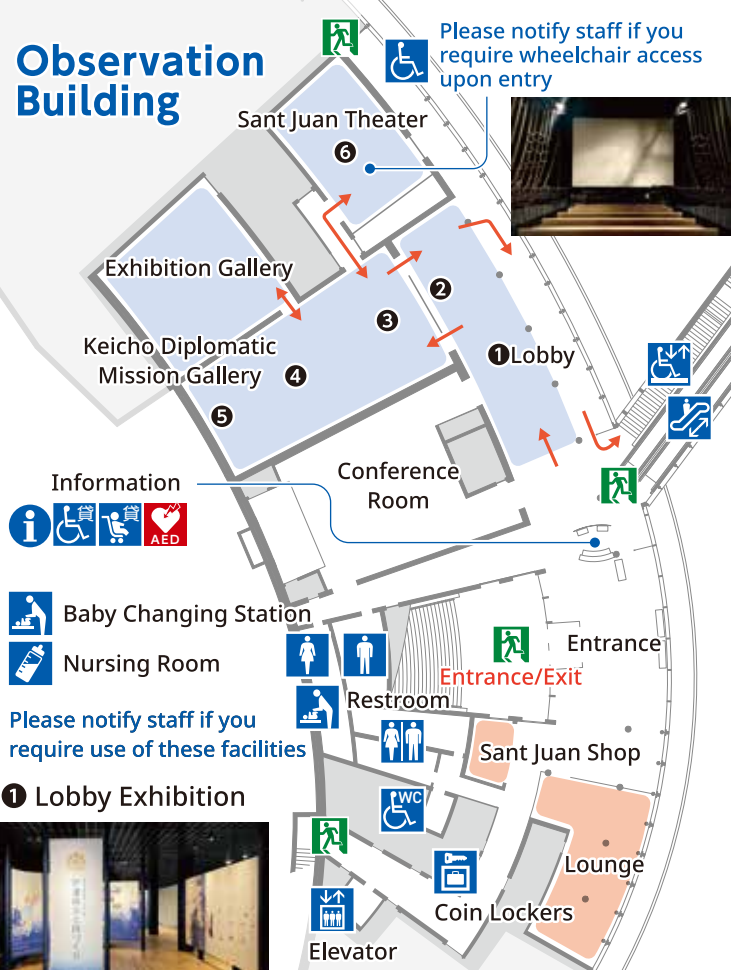

Take in the scale of the journey using this globe, which represents the 17th-century document "Complete Map of All Nations on Earth".

Experience the splendid atmosphere of the envoy's audience with the Pope, recreated using detailed reliefs and colorful images!

6 Film Theatre - "Yume-Utsutsu"

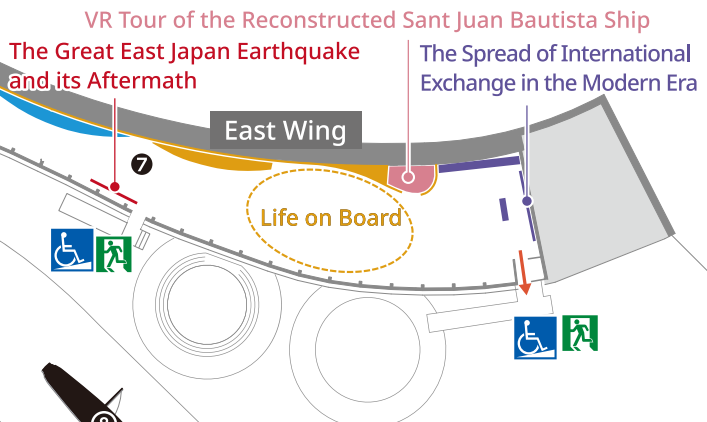

7 East Wing

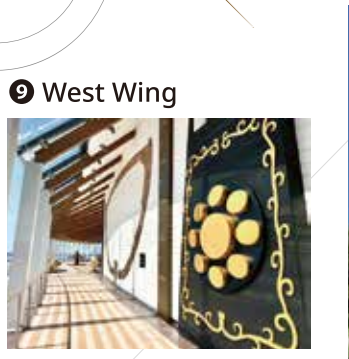


Learn about building sailing ships, life on deck, and navigation technologies. Explore the interior of the ship at our VR corner!
